



East Stanley School Sport Premium Information 2016-2017

The Government provides additional funding to schools to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools in England - The **Primary PE & Sport Premium**. This is to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles in all pupils.

This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. The sport funding can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

We will ensure that our sports premium is sustainable by improving the overall quality of PE across the school and maintaining this as we go. We will improve the quality and teaching of PE by providing long term training for staff to ensure that all teaching of PE is good or better and that staff have the required knowledge and skills to do this. This in turn will improve the children's skills and knowledge of the subject and result in higher levels of enthusiasm and interest for clubs and events. We will also create a feeling of enjoyment for PE in events such as Sports Week and competitions which all of the children can access. The PE leader will closely monitor the delivery and planning of the subject and deliver relevant up to date training for staff as and when necessary.
